They would be fully equipped and a teacher would be hired half time to coordinate these vans. This would require a 7 million dollars start up fee.

Pam, Ramona and Micheline are on the Science Education Advisory Board.

Micheline mentioned Fred Henderson for a future featured speaker. He is on the National Biodiesel Board. She also mentioned a magic show.

Brant talked about polarhuskies.com which is a website with a free curriculum. He said it is definitely worth checking out.

Micheline reminded members to fill out the survey that is on the tables.

Dues were discussed. The members felt that \$20 for high school teachers would still be very reasonable. Arnie suggested raising dues to \$25. Marcy said we need to continue to get good featured speakers and that requires more money.
